When asked about the “Build Our Future Bond Act,” 72 percent of likely voters support the public question, 21 percent oppose and 8 percent are not sure/don’t know/refuse to answer.

Proponents of the “Build Our Future Bond Act” say the \$750 million will be invested in academic and research facilities in colleges and universities in New Jersey. Institutions receiving funds must provide 25 percent match of the capital funding for projects by the Bond Act.

“Certainly opinions can change, but with the less than three weeks to election day, likely New Jersey voters have expressed their strong support for the higher education bond act,” said Douglas.

By a majority, but by a lesser margin, likely New Jersey voters favor the Public Question that allows changes in compensation for judges with 62 percent favoring the change in the New Jersey Constitution, 30 percent opposed and 9 percent not sure/don’t know/refuse to answer.
